

# THE LILLEBÆLT TRAIL DENMARK'S MOST BEAUTIFUL HIKE

Welcome to the Lillebælt Trail, which we selfishly have titled the most beautiful hike in Denmark! The path is marked with a hiker on blue background. This first section of the hike is a beautiful and varied trip from Strib and south to Gamborg - a total of 27 kilometers.

You will pass coastal and village milieus, beaches, open fields, wooded areas, and coastline cliffs.

Along the trail you will encounter many pretty and peaceful areas suitable for enjoying the view, your picnic lunch, or your thermos of coffee. The trail will also take you through the city of Middelfart and the Hindsgavl Peninsula, where you will be able to locate cafes or hotels offering food and lodging. Camping areas along the way offer both tenting and cabins for rent.

Section 1 of the Lillebælt Trail was inaugurated on September 14, 2018. We plan to extend the trail towards the south and east, and one continuous coastal path circumventing Funen is envisioned to eventually exist.

The trail was planned using the LQT standards (Leading Quality Trails - Best of Europe), and an LQT-certificate will be applied for once the total length reaches the required minimum of at least 50 kilometers.

### DEAR GUEST ON THE LILLEBÆLT TRAIL

The Lillebælt Trail runs across privately owned property, which is accessible to the public, so beware that you are only borrowing access on the trail.

Thus access to the Lillebælt Trail is available for pedestrians only, no biking or horseback riding allowed - except in areas where the trail is on roads and where such activities are allowed.

We hope you will appreciate the natural areas along the trail as much as the owners of the properties who live along the trail do.

#### We thank you in advance for:


- staying on the 2 meter wide marked tra
- keeping your dog leashed
- packing all your trash to the nearest trash can
- taking good care of our nature

#### On the private beaches you are allowed to:

- swim
- hang out for the day, provided you are at least 50 meters from houses
- but should refrain from using private jetties

Please be aware that landowners may occasionally close off sections of the trail because of hunting or otherwise dangerous work. In case it is necessary, you will see signage directing you to a detour which will lead you back to another point on the Lillebælt Trail. Remember that all activity in nature is at your own risk.
